# Noise and anti-social behaviour

There have been a number of complaints made recently about noise.

There is a 'noise policy' within the lease (part 1) which applies to all. This has been previously circulated to all flats and there is a copy of it in the foyer.

Noise travels exceedingly well round the building, so please be respectful of others!

If you're not sure what the appropriate times for hammering, playing loud music or shouting are: no loud noise between 10.30pm and 7.30am (weekdays) or 9.00 am (weekends).

Anti social behaviour (like spitting in the lift) makes life unpleasant for everyone.

### **Entryphones**

We seem to be experiencing some problems with the system at the moment! On <u>Sunday 6 October</u> between <u>2</u> <u>and 4pm</u> we will be going round the building to test every flat's entryphone to find out the extent of the problem.

#### Rubbish

Please can we remind everyone (again) to dispose of their rubbish responsibly!

For small bags of rubbish, there are chutes on every floor (except the ground) at both ends of the building, on the east and north stairways.

For larger bags of rubbish there are also bins at each end – by the exit from the east stairway out to the alleyway to the church hall and at the bottom of the north stairway by the entrance to the church – please use the bins nearest your flat!

For recyclable items (such as paper, card, cardboard, plastic bottles, cans and glass bottles) please use the recycling bins in the car park. Details of what you can recycle are available on the noticeboard.

Please do not leave rubbish by the litter bins on the pavement outside the building!

Please do not leave bulk items of rubbish in the foyer, corridors, on the stairways or in the electrical cupboards – for fire safety reasons these areas must be free from rubbish. If you leave rubbish in any of these you are risking the safety of everyone living here!

#### **Repairs and improvements**

Urgent repairs identified in the building survey are ongoing – details were included in the last newsletter in June.

The lights on the remainder of the 1<sup>st</sup> floor and the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor have now been upgraded to LEDs with microwave sensors.
